The General Fund of the Community Foundation also has been used to fund ongoing projects in our community. The local Community Foundation focuses on programs benefiting education, health, and families in our local communities. Control and management of the fund remains with a board of trustees selected from the Club. Over \$83,000 of donations have been made from the Community Foundation in the past five years, benefiting a wide range of local charities and service organizations.

# Ambassadorial Scholarships—Applications Available Now

All Rotarians are invited to nominate candidates for the Rotary Foundation one-year academic scholarship (\$25,000) the six-month cultural scholarship (\$19,000), or three-month cultural scholarships. College teachers who wish to spend a year teaching abroad also can receive a \$12,500 stipend if selected. This is the largest. privately funded, international scholarships program in the world. Applicants must have completed two years of college or university course work, or have completed high school and two years in a recognized vocation. They must be citizens of a country in which there is a Rotary club. Initial application is made through the local Rotary club in the applicant's legal or permanent residence or place of full-time study or employment. Rotarians, employees of Clubs, Districts or RI, lineal descendants (children or grandchildren) or spouses of lineal descendants, or ancestors (parent or grandparent) are not eligible.
