

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Last Week: Thanks to guest speakers, Walnut Creek City Councilwoman Gwen **Regalia, and Walnut Creek Librarian, Anne** Kane, for their presentation on local Measure L, "Libraries 2000" to be submitted for a vote in this fall's Presidential Election, November 7th. Measure L seeks to add 1/8th percent to CoCoCounty sales tax for eight years to raise an anticipated \$11 million to increase hours, restore programs for children, students, seniors, and businesses, replace worn and dated books and materials, expand access to computers and technology, and renovate library facilities. Funds will be allocated within the county based on spending plans reviewed and approved by regional board (including 1 local City Councilman and 1 member of the county Board of Supervisors).

Ms. Kane is a graduate of Simmons College in Boston (also the alma mater of Marv Epstein's daughter who also received her Library Science degree from Simmons). Ms. Regalia is a forty two year resident of Walnut Creek, former member and President of the WC School Board, and thirteen year elected member of the City Council (having served as Mayor during three years). She has been an ardent supporter of library, educational, and other civic and cultural organizations. Ms. Regalia noted during her portion of the program that even though we all are outraged by the outright theft of County and municipal property tax revenues by the State of California (over \$700 million from our County alone during the past several years), we cannot realistically expect to recover that lost funding to restore our library or other desired local programs without a continuing, and protracted legislative fight at the state level. Measure L is designed as an interim solution, to restore services and repair and rebuild our local library resources while that battle continues. Measure L's proponents cite studies which support centralized administration, on at least a county-wide level, as being the most efficient and economical means of delivering highquality library services to the public.
