Last Week: Thanks to guest speaker, Dr. Lawrence Diller, who spoke to us about the uses and mis-uses of Ritalin and other stimulants to treat hyperactivity or inattentive behavior in children and some adults. While drug treatments are important, and effective, for many persons suffering from these conditions, there has been a tendency (particularly in the US) towards overuse of prescription drugs as opposed to other forms of treatment. One factor is that managed care programs attempt to decrease the amount of time that doctors and other health care professionals spend with patients, substituting drugs for more expensive, and time-consuming, human labor. For Dr. Diller, the key to treatment is to spend a significant amount of time with each patient, carefully examining the home and school (or work) setting, addressing specific issues and problems and devising a comprehensive approach to treatment.

Ambassadorial Scholarships—Applications Available Now: All Rotarians are invited to nominate candidates for the Rotary Foundation one-year academic scholarship (\$25,000) the six-month cultural scholarship (\$19,000), or three-month cultural scholarships. College teachers who wish to spend a year teaching abroad also can receive a \$12,500 stipend if selected. This is the largest, privately funded, international scholarships program in the world. Applicants must have completed two years of college or university course work, or have completed high school and two years in a recognized vocation. They must be citizens of a country in which there is a Rotary club. Initial application is made through the local Rotary club in the applicant's legal or permanent residence or place of full-time study or employment. Rotarians, employees of Clubs, Districts or RI, lineal descendants (children or grandchildren) or spouses of lineal descendants, or ancestors (parent or grandparent) are **not eligible**.
