# Announcement of Change to Community Foundation By-Laws:

California Rotary License Plates feature the motto "Service Above Self" and the emblem of Rotary International, and are "moving billboards" for Rotary, providing a wide-ranging, colorful, reminder of Rotary's ideals.

We need a minimum of 7,500 applications and checks to be submitted to the California Rotary License Plate Team in the year 2002. As of October 29, there are 1467 or about 20% of the total needed. These applications and checks must be presented to the California DMV before they will start making our Rotary License Plates. We NEED everyone's help to get as much awareness and exposure of this worthy project as soon as possible.
