#### **Rotary Club Membership Practices** Proposed Policy Changes, Rotary Club of Walnut Creek

Background: Rotary International recently changed several areas related to membership. The following is a summary of these changes:

A. There shall be only two classes of membership- Active and Honorary. (An "Active" pays dues to R.I. and an "Honorary" does not. Local Rotary clubs can bestow "Honorary" membership on an individual because of community leadership.)

- B. Missed meeting attendance can be made up by attending another Rotary club's meeting or participating in any club committee meeting or project. The "make-up" can occur up to two weeks before or two weeks after the missed meeting.
- C. Each local club may adopt its own rules relative to attendance required of "Active" members, providing that the basic membership rules of R.I. are not violated.
- D. The "classification" rules were changed to permit additional "active" members from the same business or profession, limited to no more than 5% from any one classification in small clubs (50 or less members) or 10% in large clubs.

In order to bring the Rotary Club of Walnut Creek in

line with the RI membership changes and establish workable local rules, the following changes are proposed:

Proposed Policy Changes: Establish local status categories as follows:

"Gold Member"...one who meets a "Rule of 100" (age plus years of Rotary service) would be exempt from meeting attendance but would have the regular dues' cost.

"Silver Member"...one who meets a "Rule of 85" (age plus years of Rotary service) would have a meeting attendance requirement of three meetings a quarter and regular dues' cost. (Regular meeting or approved make-up.)

"Exemplar Member"...one who is selected by the Board in recognition of years of service to the club and special circumstances. This category is eligible for reduced dues to be established by the Board and would be exempt from attendance requirements.

"Leave of Absence"... for extended illness or temporary residence away from the local club area or other shortterm commitment making attendance impossible.

Anyone in the "leave" category on 30 June 2002 would be continued in that category subject to the length of term approved by the Board.

Members currently in Senior Active Excused category as of 30 June 2002 would be "grand-fathered" in the Silver or Gold category depending on their years of service and age; except that any such member can be placed in the Gold category upon their request.

These changes, if approved by the Club, would become effective at the beginning of the new Rotary year, 1 July 2002.
