Membership Rules Changes Effective July 1, 2002

Attendance Secretary **Quentin Alexander** provides the following report on membership rules changes adopted by our Rotary Club which affect several areas related to membership effective July 1, 2002. These changes are in conformity to Rotary International Membership practices.

Missed meeting attendance: can be made up by attending another Rotary club's meeting or participating in any club committee meeting or project. The "make-up" can occur up to two weeks before or two weeks after the missed meeting. For meetings not made-up, a \$10 fine will be assessed. We have established local status categories as follows:

"Gold Member"...one who meets a "Rule of 100" (age plus years of Rotary service) would be exempt from meeting attendance but would have the regular dues' cost.

"Silver Member"...one who meets a "Rule of 85" (age plus years of Rotary service) would have a meeting attendance requirement of three meetings a quarter and regular dues' cost. (Regular meeting or approved make-up.)

"Exemplar Member"...one who is selected by the Board in recognition of years of service to the club and special circumstances. This category is eligible for reduced dues to be established by the Board and would be exempt from attendance requirements.

"Leave of Absence"... for extended illness or temporary residence away from the local club area or other short-term commitment making attendance impossible.

Note: members who become eligible for and desire the Gold or Silver category or seek a "Leave of Absence" must request the change in writing to the Board of Directors.

Limited Grandfather Provision: Members who were in the Senior Active Excused category as of 30 June 2002 have been "grand-fathered" into the Silver or Gold category depending on their years of service and age; except that any such member can be placed in the Gold category upon their request.

2002-2003 Directory on CD!

Rotary International has begun publishing the official directory on CD. The directory is in

Adobe Acrobat format and is self running. You do not need a copy of Acrobat installed on your computer to use it.

Like the hard copy edition of the directory it lists all of the general officers, committees, districts and clubs (with their meeting locations, dates and times) as well as other information of interest to Rotarians.

We will produce personal copies of this CD for anyone in the club who would like one. There is a small fee of \$5 to do this to cover the cost of the media, making the copy and make a small donation to the club. If you would like a personal copy let Clint, the club secretary, know.
