The New Rotary "eClub One"

Attendance Secretary, Quentin Alexander, notes that there is a new way to make-up a missed meeting. The June issue of "The Rotarian"...reports that you can visit Rotary eClub One of District 5450 at www.rotaryeclubone.org. This online-only club offers several options for an informative, interactive session that will count as your meeting make-up."

Log on to the website, follow the prompts for a meeting make-up, read the article(s) chosen, complete the make-up form and submit the completed form. A make-up card will be provided for you that you turn in for credit.

"The hits keep coming for Rotary's only cyber club."

Chartered January 2002 as Rotary's first Internet-based club, Rotary eClub One of District 5450 (www.rotaryeclubone.org) exists to serve Rotarians with special needs, including those who cannot maintain attendance at regular club meetings because of extensive business commitments and travel, health problems, or geographical isolation from existing clubs.

Operating as part of the New Models for Rotary

Clubs Pilot Project, eClub One has developed policies and procedures intended to maintain the essence of Rotary goals and values while providing online flexibility to its members, who now number about a dozen, and to the thousands of Rotarians who visit the site to make up missed meetings 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The make-up component, which eClub One has designated as its international service project, began in February 2002. To date, more than 8,000 Rotarians have made up meetings by reading one of five informational programs linked to the site and completing a make-up form. The form asks the guest to discuss the information, including how it might relate to his or her home club's activities, and to suggest topics for future make-up programs.

"I think that the eclub is a great way to make up," says Kim S. Hubbard, past president of the Rotary Club of Covington, Ga., USA. "It offers me the flexibility to learn about Rotary on my own time versus having to make up at a club that only meets once a week. In a world where commitments are increasing and time stays the same, it's refreshing to have avenues such as eClub One."

Members of eClub One also use the Internet to conduct board meetings, host the district governor's visit, pay dues, and evaluate project proposals. The club also provides a public forum where visitors can share their observations and suggestions about how to improve its services.

As a New Models club, eClub One has amended the traditional Rotary Club Constitution and Bylaws to better fit the club's purpose. Thus, rather than meeting attendance requirements, members complete 12 "participation hours" per quarter in community service projects, online club programs, visits to other Rotary clubs, and other approved Rotary-related activities.

"Each member identifies some form of local community service to combine with club programs and club visits to meet their participation requirements," says

club president John Minter.

"Except for the participation requirement and conducting our business on the Internet, eClub One is like any other Rotary club doing the things Rotary clubs normally do," he says. "We visit other clubs. We attend presidents-elect training seminars, the International Assembly, district conferences, and Foundation dinners. We have yet to apply for a Matching Grant project, but we're working on it, and all members contribute \$100 annually to a Paul Harris continuing membership."

The club has no geographical requirements, so members may live anywhere in the world. Current members may propose new ones, or prospective members may fill out an online application form. The admission process, however, is quite rigorous, requiring three references, plus confirmation by the governor of the district in which the applicant resides if the applicant is a Rotarian. District dues continue to be paid to the member's home district.

Minter acknowledges that one puzzle eClub One has yet to solve is how to attract new members from the ranks of qualified non-Rotarians. He adds that the goal is to increase membership to 20 by the end of this Rotary year.
