

Yes, Virginia, there is a Community Foundation of the Rotary Club of Walnut Creek. It is a bonafide 501(c) 3 tax exempt entity, so your contributions are <u>all</u> tax deductible. With the year-end close at hand there is still time to make your charitable contributions to worthwhile causes. Your contributions can be specifically designated either to the endowment fund where the capital builds-up and only interest income is used, or can be contributed directly to the operating fund which goes to support our many local charitable endeavors.

For 2003-04 community service projects funded by the foundation included: dictionaries for all 4th grade classes in the Walnut Creek schools, summer leadership scholarships, Special Olympics, DARE, Garden Center at Heather Farms, Family Stress Center, Las Lomas Scholarship, Rotoplast matching grant, etc. Other projects include a Rotary Centennial project, which is bridge that is part of the Heather Farms restoration project, the addition of dressing rooms for the Assistance League, and an I-House tour in conjunction with UC Berkeley tour of agricultural endeavors in Contra Costa County. In addition to the above grants, our foundation also pledged \$17,000 to the Rotary International Foundation "Polio Plus" program and we are 80% fulfilled.

As you can see, our local foundation supports a wide variety of programs in our local community.

(Please note that our local community foundation is separate and apart from the Rotary International Foundation, which is supported through contributions towards a Paul Harris Fellowship.)

Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus; and part of that visage is made up of the members of our own club, and others who support our community foundation.
