Attention Paul Harris Fellows:

As a fully paid Paul Harris Fellow, you or another person, have contributed \$1000.00 in your name to The Rotary Foundation

of Rotary International, either as a lump sum or in increments which accumulate to that amount. (Example: As a "Sustaining Member" donating \$100 per year for ten years or \$200 per year for five years.) Any amount you contribute over \$1000.00 adds toward your additional recognition as a "Multiple Paul Harris Fellow" and *at the same time* may be assigned by you to another person toward a Paul Harris Recognition for that person, called the "Recipient." In other words "you *both* get credit." The recipient can be a family member, spouse, parent, child, or friend. Special community leaders, speakers, and other Rotarians are a few examples of potential "Recipients." When that person accumulates \$1000 in their account they will be named a Paul Harris Fellow.

The use of these Foundation Recognition credits is **best** done at the time of donation. This will avoid additional paperwork in having to make a "transfer" of these credits later. There is a provision on the donation form for the information concerning the "Recipient." If no "Recipient" is named, the credits will remain on the Donor's account pending the submission of a "Transfer Form" at a future time authorized by the donor. Transfer of Foundation Recognition points held by the club must be authorized by the club president or club foundation chairman. Foundation credits held by the district must be transferred by authorization of the District Governor or the District Foundation Chairman. This additional recognition encourages continued contributions by those contributors who have reached the first step in a long tradition of support of The Rotary Foundation by becoming multiple Paul Harris Fellows. Those who are not Paul Harris Fellows and have unassigned available Foundation Credits may also transfer them as Matching Credits to encourage additional giving by offering to "match" a new donation with their unassigned credits.
