#### **Wheelchair Project Update**

Pres Clint obtained the following update on the Wheelchair fundraising project led by Jack Matkin. Our money (along with that from the Redding clubs) has now been matched by RI and \$75,000 sits in an account with Redding West Rotary Club. The Shanghai Club will be making its financial contribution and then factory orders to manufacture the chairs will be placed by the Shanghai Club with guidance from the collaboration organizations — China Disabled Person's Association and the Huangshan Women's' Association. Building the wheelchairs, selecting the recipients, and distributing 1250 wheelchairs will take some time. The Club will continue to monitor this project.
