Special Presentations

Thanks to the following Rotarians for "filling in" when our planned program didn't materialize on May 15.

Mel Bacher gave us a status report on his Parkinson's treatment. Last August, Mel underwent deep brain stimulation treatment at UCSF. This is a very special program and Mel went through a lot of tests to qualify for it. The surgery implanted probes in his brain which Mel can stimulate with electrical current through a remote control device. Mel's speech noticeably improved in just the last few weeks, and it was great to hear Mel's voice and his positive attitude at our meeting. He also reported that his tremors have gone away. So, the treatment seems to be going very well thus far.

Kim Brandt reported to us on her 13 years of service on the Pleasant Hill City Council, including one year as Mayor. She served during the years in which Pleasant Hill planned and developed its the brand new "downtown" theater, restaurant, and shopping complex, along with a revised General Plan. Walnut Creek and other cities have now taken elements of the Pleasant Hill experience to revitalize areas of their existing or new "downtown" development projects. If you or your business is involved in community development planning, Kim would be happy to share her experiences with you.

Joe Stein reported on the Walnut Festival plans for 2007, and its theme "It's a Small Town After All." The Festival committee is attempting to get back the "community/non-profit" oriented focus, and involve schools and other non-profit groups in the planning and activities. Plans are to include pre-teen, teen, and organization/business booth exhibition areas. 18 restaurants are signed up to participate.

Good Bye Polio!

In the history of mankind we have been successful in eradicating only one decease; small pox. For over two decades Rotary and the World Health Organization has worked tirelessly at running polio to the ground to make it the second scourge we have eliminated. For the past 10 years we have remained so very close but still so very far, for if there is even one case we will not be at our goal. We can not let up in our pressure to

consign polio to the history books. To have gotten so close and not do so is simply not acceptable.

As of this month, the world wide "case count" was 145 cases of polio. For comparison, in 2006 there were a total of 1,996 cases with 309 cases reported through May. 145 compared to 309... over a 50% decrease! It is a hard fight but we are winning!

Rotary has asked every on of its members to step forward this year with a donation of \$12.50... less than the cost of a lunch. At our meeting on June 5th we will have a special presentation on polio and the campaign to eradicate it and the part Rotary is playing. Our district will match our donations of \$12.50 per Rotarian. **President Clint** is confident that we can and will do much better than "just what is required". He will be calling on every one of us to stand up and support this effort on that day.
