As a Rotarian you will be very aware that the eradication of polio is Rotary's most significant contribution bar none. Only once has a disease been eradicated when we eliminated another scourge, small pox.

I want to thank each of you, my fellow Rotarians, who were at that meeting and stood with me to make our club's donation this year to this program. Rotary's suggested donation to support this program this year was \$12.50. But boy, did you all come

through! We raised \$3,535.00 to fight polio! That is an average of \$84.00 per Rotarian at that meeting. I can not say thank you enough for your support. I don't believe I have ever been prouder to be a Rotarian and a member of this club.

Oh, and did I mention... our foundation has also donated and additional \$3,000 to polio eradication. That makes over six thousand dollars! Way to go!
