

## Rotary Trip to Nigeria for National Immunization Day Nov 10-20 2007

District 5170 has organized a tour for up to 100 persons to work on the West Africa Project Fair (WAPF) and National Immunization Days (NIDs) in Nigeria, Nov 10-20. Here is a summary of the key details. This tour is expected to sellout quickly, so if you are interested, please contact Howard Tours below:

1. The NID/WAPF trip will depart November 10<sup>th</sup> and return November 20<sup>th</sup>. Contact Howard tours for a PDF file that gives a detailed description of the trip, the price, the terms and conditions and an application. 2. To join the trip, you must provide a completed and signed application, AND a check of \$400 per person. Deposits MUST be by check, and not credit cards, although the final and most substantial payment can be made by Visa or Master Card.

3. Based upon the capacity and limitations of the Nigerian Rotarians this trip must be limited to the first 100 people who sign up. You may want to consider sending your registration material by overnight delivery.

4. Once the tour program is filled, Howard Tours will create a waiting list in the order they have received the completed application and deposit. If they cannot clear you off of the wait list, they will return your check to you without penalty.

5. Unfortunately, based on KLM Airline's rules, no changes to the air reservations are possible. If you want to purchase the air reservations that come with the tour program, you will need to get to the origination city. However, please note that we are offering a "Land Only" package for those who would prefer to secure and purchase their own airline reservations. In this case, they will provide you with the ground services as stated in the enclosed material.

6. Finally, please note the comments in the attached material regarding the bedding situation at the hotel in Abuja. Anyone who will be traveling alone and may want to share a double occupancy room that the Rockview Royale Hotel ONLY has ONE king bed in each room. Therefore, by accepting a shared double occupancy room they MUST agree to share a bed. The only other option they have is to purchase a single supplement.
