Today's Program: Michael Monaldo, AIA Update on John Muir Hospitals, Walnut Creek and Concord

Today's speaker, Michael Monaldo, is the Vice President of Facilities Development for John Muir Health System. He is responsible for the planning, management and financial aspects of all construction and renovation projects for John Muir Health. The current capital program will exceed \$800 Million during the next 4 years. Since joining John Muir Health, Michael has been responsible for starting construction of two major Patient Care Towers at the Walnut Creek and Concord Campuses. The Thomas J. and Muriel T. Long Patient Care Tower at Walnut Creek includes 242 beds, 3 Operating Rooms and an expanded Emergency Department / Trauma Center. The Patient Care Tower in Concord will house the Cardiac Care Institute and includes 61 beds, 3 Cardiac Cath Labs and a new expanded Emergency Department. In addition to these projects, his teams recently completed a new 767 space parking structure, a new Emergency Department and an Ambulatory Surgery Center in Walnut Creek along with a new 60,000 reference laboratory in Concord.

Michael is a licensed architect with more than 17 years experience in major health care projects. Prior to joining John Muir Health, Michael was Director of Project Development for Kaiser Permanente. In this role, he was responsible for entitlements, master planning, design, and agency approvals for all major projects in northern California. The budget for this capital program exceeded \$1.2 billion annually. Michael also served as Project Director for the Kaiser Antioch Medical Center. He was responsible for delivery of this new 600,000 sf medical center on an undeveloped 50 acre site. Prior to Kaiser, Michael served as Project Director for Saint John's Heath Center in Santa Monica, California where he was responsible for an 8 year phased replacement project. It included a 475,000 sf hospital, central utility plant and 474 space subterranean parking structure.

Michael lives in Walnut Creek with his wife, Valerie Nagel, and their 3 sons, Dante, Dominic and Marcus. On his free time, he enjoys cycling and skiing. He also coaches soccer and baseball for his sons' teams.
