"Yosemite Beautification" Hands On Service Project, Monday May 2nd (including overnight camping Sunday May 2 and Monday Night. Michele MckayMcCoy provides the following special invitation: If you want to participate contact Michele mckaymccoy@comcast.net right away (before this Friday). Space is very limited. "In the face of incredibly long odds, we have won the lottery at Yosemite National Park to be one of the 20 group work projects for 2021. In a normal (i.e. pre-pandemic) year there are 75 - 100 projects, and even then the odds are never in your favor. (Yes, I know "The Hunger Games" are YA books, but good writing is good writing, no matter the audience.)"

"We get free entrance to the Park on Sunday, May 2 and free camping at Upper Pines in Yosemite Valley at noon on Sunday, Sunday night and Monday night. The work day is Monday, May 3 from 9 am to 2 pm. Departure date is May 4 by noon. The work project is "Yosemite Beautification" which could mean anything but is likely to mean cleaning out fire rings in campsites. This means you need grubby work clothes."

"Here's the bad news. The group of volunteers is limited to 10 people. and every person in the group must also be a worker bee; no free loaders. Be prepared. No RV's, no pets, no youngsters are allowed. You will need a serious tent and a serious sleeping bag. It's cold in the valley, even in May. You can rent from REI or I can help. Probably.
