As an avid seamstress, during the Covid-19 crisis she has made cloth masks. Michele is looking forward to doing other things to serve the community with our Club. Information from Pres Jesse and the Club Board regarding the 2020-2021 dues increase and the possibility of resuming live meetings. Please send in your annual dues before the end of the month if possible. This will help with our accounting with Rotary International. There has

been some concern about the \$50 dues increase for 2020-2021. This decision was made by the board at a time when we were looking at an annual deficit for the current year of over \$8,000 due to increased rental fees, lunch costs, Kohoku Exchange and IHouse costs. The increase would have covered less than half of that anticipated deficit. Since that time, and due to unexpected savings from cancelled events and cancelled live lunch meetings, it looks like we actually will finish this year with a surplus. But we still anticipate a need for the increased dues for the new 2020-2021 year because we now hope to be able to resume live meetings (with increased rental costs and lunch costs). However, this also is good news in that we may be able to resume live meetings at the Garden Center in August, possibly with Zoom participants on the big screen. It is difficult to predict the timing and how this will affect our budget but we are hopeful for a break-even year in 2020-2021 with the increased dues level.
