The school is an all boys high school with about 295 students. The useful life of the books should be about 5 years or \$1.35/student/year. There was some discussion as to why we funded an all boys school and not coed. The primary reason was that most girls in Kenya don't attend

high school, and those that do go to all girls schools. Robert Freeman, who is the director of The Global Uplift Project, believes that as the boys are educated the women's standard of living rises also.


