At ten o'clock in the evening, they began to hide from the air, according to the locals, - they did a few rounds over the village and started over. There are no military objects in the village, there is no gathering of our military, the village is actually very small. It was. Up to this morning. There is no greater village.

In the truck of the dead bodies. Understand that all this needs to be filmed, but I can't, I just can't.

In the photo in a blue blanket - the dead owner of the house, his wife's body is still looking for under the ruins.

Residents of neighboring settlements came to the village - to help undress everything. Elderly men with red tears in their eyes scream at the camera that the killer is a fucking killer. The woman, in whose house was overnight, nine people, complained that the whole breast was in the bruise, because when it all started, she fell on the children and covered them up.

No I'm not okay and I probably never will ever be. I envy those who can cry.
