# Open Space project. Don Willoughby

The staining workday has been re-scheduled for Saturday March 18th, weather permitting. We'll have morning and afternoon shifts that day, and we'll need at least 6-7 folks working each shift. The goal is to put at least a first coat of stain on all of the lumber for the first pergola. We'll most likely need a second work day for a second coat, probably March 22nd or March 25th - depending on the weather and availability of volunteers. If the weather cooperates, there will be a major construction work day on Saturday April 1st to install the main framework on foundations built by the City crews. After April 1, construction days to complete the construction will have to be on weekdays, and I'll be contacting those who signed up for weekday work to arrange those days. If anyone would like to be added to the list of volunteers, please email me with preferences for staining or construction and whether they can work weekdays.. (Also, if anyone has some sawhorses that they could loan for the staining days, please contact me.)

# **Book Fundraiser.**

Hello, my name is Betsy! I'm helping to run a book drive fundraiser to help reach 150 foster children in Contra Costa County. The book drive would be sponsored members and friends of the Rotary club in association with a publishing company called PaperPie. The goal is for each child to receive an EmpowerME pack: \$50 worth of high quality, new books that fuel their knowledge and wellness, packaged in a cinch backpack. Because of PaperPie's matching per donation, it's only \$35 to sponsor one child, \$70 to sponsor two children, \$105 to sponsor 3 children and so on.

I learned about PaperPie shortly after my daughter was born. At first, I was simply buying their books and reading to her when she was a baby. Because of how much I loved their books and believe in literacy as a lifestyle, I signed up to become a brand partner. I don't do many personal sales, but instead, focus my efforts on book drives for schools, learning centers and daycare's and book drive fundraisers for children who may not otherwise have the luxury of having new books and toys. I'm excited to partner with the Rotary Club of Walnut Creek to support our foster youth population.
