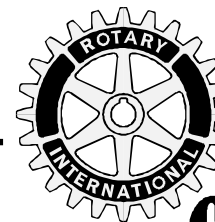

Charitable Contributions Made by the Rotary Club of Walnut Creek Community Foundation

Our Community Foundation recently awarded three \$500 scholarships to graduating high school seniors, \$1,000 to the Mt. Diablo Open Space, \$1,000 to the Boy Scouts of America, and \$1,000 to the Wardrobe for Opportunity.

In the past five years, our Community Foundation has made approximately \$95,000 in grants to local programs benefiting families, youth, and seniors including the following:

Bakers visitation program \$3,000; Lindsay Museum computer \$2,650; Meals on Wheels \$1,700; Special Olympics \$2,050; Christmas in April \$1,000; California Symphony Elementary Schools Project \$1,000; I-House Farm Project \$1,500; Jewish Community Center \$1,000; Mexico Hospital Beds project with Sunrise Rotary \$1,000; other projects over \$3,000.
