# Our speaker Susan Prather ...(continued from front)...

Prior to the advent of Fresh Start, Susan, at her own expense, advocated vigorously for the rights of the homeless and others in Contra Costa. The California State Assembly in a 1994 resolution recognized her tireless efforts. In the spring of 2001 Susan received the "For People Who Care" award from the Contra Costa Continuum of Care Board. In Spring 2002 she was presented with the "Women Working for Justice" award by the Contra Costa County Commission for Women. In 2004 Susan received The Honorable Mention in the Contra Costa County Humanitarian of the Year award ceremony, honoring individuals for work performed in the spirit of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Also in 2004, the Walnut Creek Journal named Susan Prather one of "Six People Who Made Our Lives Better in 2003." In September of 2006, Susan received the Bay Area Jefferson Award, a great honor, and her life's work and Fresh Start were featured on KPIX Television News. KCBS Radio and in the San Francisco Chronicle.
